Referral service helps residents find assistance

A referral service which addresses basic needs is not only helping more people in Alcona County but is also expanding its service to in-

clude all but one county in northeast Michigan.

The referral service 2-1-1 is a free, easy-to-remember telephone number which connects people in need with people who can help - 24 hours a day, seven days a

Alcona County became a 2-1-1 service area about three years ago. Only two counties in northeast Michigan are not currently connected to it,

Ogemaw and Iosco. However, according to Alcona County Commissioner Brummund, Ogemaw County is in the process of getting the Federal Communication Commission's approval for 2-1-1 service.

Brummund is on the 2-1-1 Board of Directors and on its executive committee. She said it is a service she is passionate about because of how helpful it is to people who have no idea where to turn and she is delighted that more and more people are being helped by having the service.

According to Brummund, 73 Alcona County residents utilized the 2-1-1 service in its first year of availability in 2012; last year 127 used the service and this year, between January 1 and December 12, 210 Alcona County residents called seeking referral assistance. "The numbers are growing more and more every year as people learn about it," Brummund said.

The 2-1-1 service refers people to resources in their community. After dialing 2-1-1, a trained professional will assess the caller's situation, identify needs and refer the caller to the resources which can help. Calls are confidential and callers can remain anonymous if they wish.

The service has a vast list of referral phone numbers which can connect the caller to assistance in many ways including:

- Basic human need referrals: Food banks, clothing, shelters, utility payment assistance and more.
- · Physical and mental health referrals: Crisis intervention services, support groups and medical information lines, et cetera.
- Employment support: Unemployment benefits, financial assistance, job training, et cetera.
- Support for veterans, older Americans and people with disabilities: Health care, adult day care, independent living, work force training, Meals on Wheels, et cetera.
- Support for children, youth and families: Quality childcare, Success by Six programs, after school programs, summer camps, mentoring, tutoring and more.
- Crisis calls: Suicidal thoughts, domestic violence, et cetera.

Firearm deer harvest down from last year

The 2014 firearm deer season wrapped up on November 30, and challenging conditions and lower deer numbers in some areas likely have led to fewer deer being taken this year.

Each year the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) generates preliminary estimates of the firearm deer harvest shortly after the season closes. Those estimates are later replaced by a rigorous assessment of harvest and participation over all deer seasons using an annual hunter mail sur-

The 2014 firearm deer season harvest appears to have decreased in all regions this year, but particularly in the Upper Peninsula. Experiences can differ widely within regions. DNR biologists estimate that, compared to 2013, the harvest was down approximately 30 to 40 percent across the Upper Peninsula, decreased perhaps as much as 10 percent in the northern Lower Peninsula, and was down about five percent in the southern Lower Penin-

Deer populations in the Upper Peninsula are down after two severe past winters. The DNR significantly reduced antlerless quotas prior to this season and has invested in habitat improvement and research assessing the role of predators, habitat and weather conditions in driving U.P. deer abundance.

The 2014 deer season forecast indicated hunters should expect to see fewer deer in the region, and some locations also saw more than 40 inches of snow accumulation before the firearm season opened, making hunting access challenging and driving deer to migrate out of such areas earlier than nor-

The number of deer brought to our check stations declined as much as 60

percent in some locations, though hunter success was somewhat better in areas with higher deer densities," said Upper Peninsula Regional Supervisor Terry Minzey. "Winter severity has moderated since then, but we'll continue to monitor conditions and regional deer populations through the months to come.'

Deer harvest did not decline as dramatically in the Lower Peninsula. "The tough winter last year did not impact deer populations below the bridge as it did in the Upper Peninsula," said

Ashley Autenrieth, Wildlife Division deer biologist for the northern regions. "But reduced antler size this season indicated deer condition was affected."

Concentrations of standing corn that provide secure cover for deer contributed to adverse hunting conditions in some locations. Brent Rudolph, Wildlife Division research specialist, also said that "department research in one southern Michigan study area indicates deer numbers are still only slowly rebounding following an extensive outbreak of epizootic hemorrhagic disease several summers ago."

The research project is being conducted in collaboration with Michigan State University, with assistance from many hunter volunteers, and also has received financial support from Safari Club International.

Rudolph also stressed the importance of cooperation with Michigan's hunter harvest survey, what he called "a vital tool for Michigan's deer program, and another important way in which data provided by hunters contributes to our information base."

Hunters who do not receive a survey in the mail but who wish to provide their hunting and harvest information may visit www.michigan.gov/deer and select the "Complete a Deer Harvest Survey Online" link. Hunters should only provide this information once they have completed all of their 2014 deer hunting activities.





Clarification

Dr. Dan O'Brien, veterinary specialist for the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR), made the following statement to provide some clarification in the story "Bovine TB still an issue in northern Michigan" in the December 3 issue of the Review — in the third full paragraph on page six that begins "If we are able...", what I meant to say and should have conveyed more clearly was this. 'Our modeling research indicates that if we are able to sustain the same hunter effort we've had so far relative to deer numbers and baiting compliance, we should expect only about a half percent decrease in TB prevalence (from what it is now) over the next 30 years. But it's very likely that TB won't be gone entirely. As far as the progress that has already been made, we (that is, hunters and the DNR) have reduced TB prevalence in the deer herd in Deer Management Unit 452 by about 65 percent since 1995 (from 4.9 percent with TB in 1995 to 1.7 percent as of 2013)."

Tax Season Volunteers

Anyone looking for a way to help their community is asked to consider becoming a tax volunteer to provide free tax return preparation for people who need tax help but can't afford it. People with low-to-moderate incomes, seniors and people with disabilities usually qualify for this free service. No previous experience is required. Volunteers receive specialized training in January and have the option of serving in a variety of roles. The AARP and the IRS provide equipment and materials that allow volunteers to prepare basic individual income tax returns.

Volunteers learn many aspects of tax return preparation. This includes tax deductions and credits that benefit eligible taxpayers, like the Earned Income Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit and Michigan Property Tax Credits and Heating Credit. The hours to volunteer are flexible. Volunteers generally serve an average of three to five hours per week. After successful training in January, a volunteer may volunteer at any of the sites through the tax filing deadline which will be April 15, 2015. Volunteers are needed at the two locations in Alpena, as well as locations in Tawas, Oscoda, Hale, Lincoln and

MacNeill said, "The plaque was a really kind gesture and is a measure of the deep re-





\$330,000 for the 20 counties it serves. Funding for 2-1-1 comes through a variety of sources, according to 2-1-1 **Executive Director Sarah** Kile. "Each county in our service area pays 15 cents per person in their county. In many counties the local United Way contributes a portion of the amount. Some counties get private contributions, some get county, city and township donations and still do fundraisers like garage sales and donation tins. The rest comes from corporate sponsors such as Dow Chemical Company and Consumers Energy," Kile said. Brummund said 2-1-1 just

received a \$2,500 grant from FirstMerit Bank. She said for the 15 cents per person Alcona County pays annually, the service is too valuable not to have. "If we help even just one person a year, it's worth it. If I was a young mother and lost my job and didn't know how I was going to feed my children or keep them warm, I could call 2-1-1 and get the information I need to help my family. Paying for 2-1-1 is part of what we can do for mankind," Brummund said.

She explained the need for 2-1-1 service varies depending on the caller's situation. "I heard (that) a call came into 2-1-1 from a single father. His young daughter needed a backpack when she started school and (he) didn't know much about it, so he called 2-1-1. During the conversation he shared with the 2-1-1 professional he was trying to get his little girl ready for school on a limited income and it was difficult to know what was needed and available," Brummund said.

She explained the father

received referral information about free lunches, where to get free clothing and coats and where to get a backpack. In all, the father received nine different referrals to help get his little girl started with school in the best possible way.

According to Brummund, the service is only as good as the efforts from organizations in which the caller is referred to. She said it's not a guarantee of service, such as heating assistance funds being readily available to a person in need.

Any person or group that wants to help should contact 2-1-1 to share what service they can offer. It's also important to call and let 2-1-1 know when the offer can no longer be given, Brummund said.

Kile explained 2-1-1 exists to give people access to upto-date information which sometimes changes rapidly. One example might be the health department which changed procedure, or lost or gained funding for a service. She said callers can call 2-1-1 to see if the service is still available in their community. "It's a place to go to get real, up-to-date information... 2-1-1, just three simple numbers which can make a world of difference in a time of need.



Targeting walleye throughout the day

When anglers target walleye through the ice they often experience different levels of activity as the day progresses. In early morning, around sunrise, the fish will be active and you may want to use larger lures and more aggressive jigging.

As time wears on those fish will scale their intensity back - during that time you'll want to select smaller lures.

When all activity seems to have dropped off you'll want to consider sitting tight and waiting for the fish to come to you. Then, as sunset nears, often their activity will pick up and you'll want to revert back to your early morning strategies.

Fire danger increases during holidays

time for celebration and gathering together with family and friends, it is also a time for heightened awareness of the dangers of fire.

"The holiday season is a time when the risk of experiencing a house fire is increased," said Michigan State Police Community Service Trooper Ashley Simpson. "Some contributing factors

While the holidays are a include increased cooking in the kitchen, Christmas trees that get dry, the use of candles, electrical outlets that become overloaded. frayed electrical cords, unsafe holiday decorations and increased commotion in the house that might leave children unattended."

According to the U.S. Fire Administration, one of every three home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.

The good news is these tragedies can be avoided by adopting some basic fire safety behaviors. Simpson offered the following fire safety reminders.

 Take care when choosing a live Christmas tree. Do not purchase one that's dry or losing its needles. Set the tree in a large, tip-proof stand, away from heat sources and exits, and water it daily. Keep presents away from hot tree

Carefully inspect decorative lights for worn or frayed cords before use. Only purchase lights and electrical decorations bearing the name of an independent testing lab (such as U. L.) and follow the manufacturer's instructions for installation and mainte-

• Always unplug lights, both inside and outside, before leaving the house or going to bed.

· Choose flame-resistant, flame retardant or non-combustible materials for holiday decorations whenever possible.

· When using candles, place them in large, tip-proof, heat resistant holders and keep them away from combustibles, children and pets.

 Take extra care when cooking. Avoid having large crowds of people in the kitchen and never leave cooking unattended. Keep the stove area clean to avoid grease fires.

 Have your chimney and furnace professionally inspected and cleaned. Don't burn gift-wrappings in the fireplace, as this can cause chimney fires.

• If you have to use space heaters, keep them at least three feet from any combustible surface or material. Don't let children near space heaters, and never use them when you are asleep.

 Have at least one smoke alarm on every level of your home, especially outside a sleeping areas. Test alarms monthly and replace batteries at least once a year.

It was well after dark when we pulled our luggage into the lobby of the Castlebay Hotel. We were greeted at the front desk by Mairi MacNeil, a true highland island princess. I signed the registry and Mairi looked at my name. With a perfect TV Scottish brogue she looked me in the eye and said, "Welcome home Warren." She said my name in a lyrical way like I have never heard it said before. Her words made me almost gasp. Her welcome gave me a feeling of belonging that I was yearning for. I had needed to feel like I was a part of this ancient site, part of something bigger than myself.

The next day we awoke to a breathtaking panoramic view of Castlebay and Kisimul Castle. We had a very fun filled and interesting three days on Barra. We soon found out that these island people had mainly four last names, MacNeill, Campbell, Mac-Dougal and MacKinnon. We also found that everyone knew each other. It felt like being home.

By the second day, wherever we went we were being called by our first names and we were calling relations and new friends by theirs. It was amusing to me that anytime something strange or different happened, the explanation was, "This is Barra." It became an excuse or explanation for many things. For

some strange reason this made perfect sense to me.

There is also a saying on Barra that explained a lot for me about some of my "issues." They say, "When a Highlander opens his mouth you can see what's in his heart." This is a great excuse for a leaky filter.

We met Lisa again on the crossing back to the mainland. Her stay on Barra was quite different than ours but equally rewarding. Her goal was to see objects; our goal was to meet people. Both of us found what we were looking for; what we took away from our visits far outreached our expectations. The problem was our visit left us wanting more.

The trip was amazing from beginning to end but during the entire time I was haunted by the statement made by Mairi MacNeil, at the hotel desk at Castlebay, "Welcome Home." That single statement still pulls me back to Barra. Someday I will give in to that pull and return.

I don't know if Mairi was trained in hospitality or hotel management. I don't know if she even realized the impact of what she said. She had nothing to gain or lose by us coming back; she had a natural love for people and her home.





Shepler's taps Moran Iron Works to build new ferry by summer

A \$3.8 million ferry, thought to be the first ever built in Michigan, will soon be under construction at Moran Iron Works in Onaway,

Shepler's Mackinac Island Ferry is investing in the project both to provide customers with the latest in ferry travel and to help bolster the northeast Michigan economy. "The idea of building a climate-controlled ferry for our customers right here in Michigan - instead of sending the work elsewhere - really appealed to us," said Bill Shepler, CEO of Shepler's. "As a third-generation family business, we're focused on giving back to the region that has been so good to us."

Shepler and Tom Moran, CEO and founder of Moran Iron Works, announced the project recently at Moran's fabrication facility, where preproduction processing and planning are already under

The 85-foot, all-aluminum ferry - to be christened "Miss Margy," after Shepler's mother-is scheduled to carry its first passengers in July 2015. It will include an airconditioned cabin, as well as a ventilation system to remove interior condensation from windows, improving the view for passengers during inclement weather.

"We're proud to work with Shepler's on one of the most unique passenger vessels on the Great Lakes," said Moran. "An all-aluminum hull, three of the most modern and powerful marine engines on the Great Lakes, along with the most advanced cabin comforts, make this project sophisticated and challenging.

"This provides thousands of man hours of work to northeast Michigan and demonstrates the Shepler family's commitment to providing jobs for our communities," Moran

Presque Isle County's nonseasonally adjusted jobless rate was 7.9 percent in October, according to the Michigan Bureau of Labor Market Information & Strategic Initiatives. Only six of the state's 83 counties had worse rates.

The keel will be laid in mid-January and the hull completed over the next four months. The ferry will then be launched through Moran's Port Calcite Collaborative, a deep-water port in nearby Rogers City, Mich., and transported to Shepler's facility in Mackinaw City, Mich. where seating will be installed and painting done.

The 281-passenger ferry, Shepler's largest, will have a top speed of about 40 mph. Shepler's has a fleet of five passenger ferries and one cargo vessel.

Moran and Shepler's have previously collaborated on modifications for two vessels, but this is their first ferry construction project. Ferries are usually constructed in ship building meccas, such as Louisiana or Sturgeon Bay, Wis. "But for this project, we liked the idea of watching it being built and having a say in how it was being built," Shepler said. "This may be Moran's first ferry, but they are so particular in what they do that there was no question in our minds that this was the right way to go. Moran is the epitome of doing it right.'

Miss Margy will be a K Class passenger vessel built in accordance with U.S. Coast Guard regulations. Moran is working with SeaCraft Design, a naval architecture and design firm based in Sturgeon Bay, Wis., for the vessel

Shared housing can help seniors in many ways

Dear Savvy Senior,

What can you tell me about senior home-sharing programs? Since my father passed away last year, my mom, who's 70, is interested in renting out a room in her house for some extra income and for the companionship. Is this a wise idea?

Housemate Hunting

Dear Hunting,

It could be a great idea if your mom has the space and can find the right housemate/ renter.

Shared housing among older adults has gotten a lot of attention lately as more and more people are recognizing that they can use their home to get help with a variety of needs, such as generating income, getting help with household chores, and even finding some much needed companionship.

But home sharing isn't for everyone. Your mom needs to carefully consider the pros and cons of renting out a room in her house, and make

doesn't want) in a housemate/renter.

To help her sort this out, the National Shared Housing Resource Center offers a 16page "Consumers Guide to Home Sharing" that provides a self-questionnaire to those considering renting their home, along with a list of renter's questions and important points to discuss, and a sample home-sharing lease agreement that lays out the details in writing. This guide costs \$10 and can be ordered at nationalsharedhousing.-

After going through the guide, if your mom wants to proceed in finding a renter, a good first step is to contact a home-sharing program in her area that matches adults who are looking for shared housing with older adults who are looking to rent.

These programs handle background checks and other screenings, and consider lifestyle criteria when making matches. They can also help

a list of what she wants (and her with the leasing agreement that the renter would sign that covers issues like smoking, pets, chores, overnight guests, use of common rooms, et cetera.

Most home-sharing programs are free to use or request a small donation. Others, however, may charge the homeowner and potential renter a fee for this service.

There are dozens of homesharing programs throughout the U.S. You can find a list at the National Shared Housing Resource Center website at nationalsharedhousing.org.

If you don't find a program that serves your area, you can also search for housemates through national resources like Let's Share Housing (letssharehousing.com), the Golden Girls Network (goldengirlsnetwork.com) and Roommates 4 Boomers (roommates4boomers.com). All of these programs offer national web-based matching programs and charge membership fees that run

If you don't have any luck with the home-sharing programs, put a call in to your Area Agency on Aging (call the Eldercare Locator at (800) 677-1116 for contact information) who may be able to offer assistance or refer you to local agencies or nonprofit organizations that offer shared housing help.

You can also check with the local senior or community center, church or temple that your mom attends to see if you can post an ad on their bulletin board or in their newsletter. Or, you can advertise in your local newspaper or online at roommates.com or craigslist.org.

If your mom finds someone on her own that she's interested in renting to, ask the prospective renter to fill out a "rental application" (see rentalleaseagreement.org to download and print one for free) and run a full tenant background check, and then call their references. Background checks can be ordered online through companies like starpointtenantscreening.com and screeningworks-.com for a small fee.



Michigan DNR's fire program celebrates 100 year anniversary

Historically, it's the years with the large wildfires that garner the most public attention. For example, in 2012 the year of the Duck Lake fire - 497 fires burned 23,814

In 2014, Michigan set a new record when it came to wildfires - a record low. This past fire season, 167 fires burned 550 acres across the state. "The record low numbers for wildfires can be attributed to damp weather conditions," said Paul Kollmeyer, who oversees the Michigan Department of Natural Resources' (DNR) wildfire suppression and prevention efforts.

In addition to the wet weather conditions keeping fire numbers low, Kollmeyer said the DNR's work to spread fire prevention messages has been key in helping to reduce the number of wildfires caused by people. "Nine out of 10 wildfires are caused by people," he said. "Our strategy has always been to get an educational prevention message out to folks of all ages. Through our efforts most people now take extra steps to be careful with fire. They also understand that they need to check if the DNR is issuing burn permits before they burn leaves and yard debris."

Spreading the fire prevention message across the state requires a lot of boots on the ground at schools, parades, fairs and other events. The DNR has 68 fire officers deployed at 48 stations across the state who - in addition to suppressing wildfires on public and private land - join their friend Smokey Bear to remind folks to be careful with fire.

"Fire officers are required

to have diverse job skills," Kollmeyer said. "They might be interacting with elementary school kids one day and building a firebreak the next day. Their jobs require a lot of specialized training. It's a job that has evolved a lot over the past 100 years."

The historic low number of wildfires corresponds to another historic event in Michigan: 2014 marks the 100th anniversary of William J. Pearson being appointed as the state's first full-time forest fire officer.

Pearson developed the state's fire control organization, starting with the aid of a few game, fish and forest wardens and some part-time assistance from a handful of temporary patrolmen, lookouts and fire wardens. He also developed a system of lookout towers and telephone lines for spotting and reporting fires. These tools and techniques gradually evolved into the fire suppression organization the DNR has today.

Prior to 1914, forest fire suppression and prevention

was handled by the timber industry, funded by a fee assessed on their ownership acreage paid to the Northern Forest Protective Association. By 1907, the legislature authorized the employment of "not more than 10 district deputy game, fish and forestry wardens to employ firefighters, impress labor and enforce the fire laws."

But it was the appointment of Pearson in 1914 that really got the ball rolling. That year, there were 935 fires reported that burned 408,765 acres. The private fire associations began to fall by the wayside as the state stepped up fire prevention and suppression efforts.

Tactics for fighting fires began to change at that time, too. When World War I began in 1914, horses were still being used to haul cannons and other heavy equipment; by the end of the war, tanks and other mechanized equipment had proved their value in navigating difficult terrain and began to be incorporated into firefighting tactics replacing horse drawn plows, axes and shovels.

This was a turning point in the way Michigan battled wildfires back then and mechanized fire fighting remains the most efficient

means to combat wildfires today.

"The reason we don't have million-acre fires anymore like we did in the 1800s is because we have mechanization and a road system to quickly respond with off-road fire fighting equipment operated by skilled fire officers," Kollmeyer said.

It didn't happen overnight. In 1923, 1,336 fires burned 466,474 acres. Two years later, 3,887 fires consumed 733,750 acres. And in 1930, there were 4,690 fires reported, burning 290,300 acres. But gradually, both the number of fires and the destruction they wreaked were reduced.

A big change occurred in 1944, when Smokey Bear was adopted in a national campaign to engage the public in fire prevention. "We still message with Smokey's help, even after 70 years," Kollmeyer said. "Our fire program is not just about fighting fires, it's about preventing fires, too. People have changed and their mindset has changed."

But the mission of fire officers hasn't. "Fire officers were originally hired for prevention and coordination," he said. "That hasn't changed."

Prescribed fire designed to

enhance wildlife habitat or reduce hazardous and invasive vegetation has become a large portion of a fire officer's duties in recent years. "This year in Michigan, there were more acres of beneficial prescribed burn treatments than what we responded to for wildfires," Kollmeyer said. "We conducted 105 burns for 10,488 acres to enhance wildlife habitat, improve forest regeneration, to control invasive plants and to reduce the risk of wildfires."

When not actively suppressing fires, fire officers spend a lot of time training – maintaining their skills as well as developing new ones. "We cooperatively train rural fire departments in wildfire fighting techniques, maintain equipment and assist with the development of new equipment," said Dana Pelton, a DNR forest fire officer supervisor in Gaylord, Mich. "Additionally, we write plans outlining parameters

that will provide the desired results for upcoming prescribed burns."

Fire officers will also assist with other forestry activities – marking timber for sale, treating diseases and removing hazardous trees (such as at Belle Isle in Detroit, Mich. this year), she said.

A background in forestry is helpful for fire officers, but it isn't the only attribute the DNR looks for when recruiting. Ability to communicate with the public, make presentations and mechanical aptitude all come into play. "It's a multifaceted job," Pelton said. "There's a lot more to it than just driving around a fire truck."

And, of course, fire officers will continue to work on enlightening the public to the dangers of wildfires. "You never know about the fire you prevented, but that's the way we like it," Pelton said. "And for those that aren't prevented – we'll be ready."



Jobs in timbering, wood products go begging

The woods are calling, and so are logging and wood products companies.

Calling for skilled employees, that is. Experts say the labor shortage hampers economic growth.

Many experienced foresters and other workers in northern Michigan are retiring. At the same time, jobs in other industries such as mining, energy and construction often pay higher wages than those at timber-related com-

The demand is expected to continue as the state looks for new uses for forest resources, including products and energy, according to the Michigan Biomaterials Initiative

More than 27,000 jobs are directly in the state's forest products industry and more than 146,000 are supported by Michigan forests, according to Michigan State University Extension.

Brenda Owen, executive director of the Michigan Association of Timbermen, said many companies struggle to find workers, especially smaller businesses. "Our members are keenly concerned about a tremendous lack of skilled labor, or even unskilled but trainable labor, for our timbering companies, our sawmills, our manufacturers," she said.

Recently launched initiatives in the western Upper Peninsula and the Onaway, Mich. area are meant to provide some of that training.

Two major factors are lack of training and lack of knowledge about opportunities, Owen said. "Everybody thinks they're going to carry chainsaws, but we have some pretty high-tech jobs available." They include lumber graders at sawmills, equipment operators and forklift operators.

Employees are needed to run state-of-the-art computerized, mechanized equipment that's operated with a joystick, like a video game.

Also in short supply: Welders able to go into the woods to fix heavy equipment and drivers for logging trucks.

We're struggling to get viable employees in those positions," Owen said. She added the association wants to collaborate with Michigan Works! to provide on-theground training.

Ironically, the recent expansion of opportunities in other industries lures people away -from timbering-related jobs. "There's no way we can compete with construction," said Brian Nelson, co-owner

of Marvin Nelson Forest Products in Cornell, Mich., near Escanaba, Mich.. "If you can operate a harvester, you can operate other heavy equip-

Nelson said his logging company competes for employees with two paper mills in the Escanaba, Mich. area. Skilled workers at the mills earn at least one and a half times what he pays. For Nelson's company, the major labor shortages are cut-tolength harvester operators and truck drivers.

"We try everything, word of mouth, unemployment offices, Craigslist, newspaper ads, wherever we can find to help," he said, adding that well-qualified harvester operators are like free agents in professional baseball and football: In heavy demand and able to name their own price.

According to Owen, "a lot of quality employable" workers in the Gaylord, Mich. area are signing on with oil and gas companies because of higher wages. And in the U.P., "there are pockets where skilled labor is going to the mining field because the mines pay more."

The labor shortage does have a bright economic side for some workers willing to work more, she said. "These guys can get overtime — I have loggers paying 20 hours

a week overtime." There are some recent initiatives underway to help close the labor gap. Last year, Gogebic Community College in Ironwood, Mich. started an associate degree program in forest technology to help

fill industry needs. "Private industry is looking for people to mark timber. The state has started hiring forestry technicians, and the county forests need people to mark timber," said Bill Perkis, the head of the program. Starting pay is in

the \$18-\$24-an-hour range. "These are the nuts-andbolts guys who walk in the woods and mark timber,' Perkis said. "There's a real demand for these technicians." The curriculum includes courses in tree identification, forest ecology and health, wildlife habitat, use of global information systems for electronic mapping, forest management and forest SOILS.

Seven students enrolled in its first academic year, and about the same number this year, Perkis said. He added the college plans to market the program beyond the U.P. and northern Wisconsin.

In the northern Lower Peninsula, the Industrial Arts Institute opened its first 15week training program in welding, graduating 16 students in mid-November. The next class starts January 6, 2015.

All graduates found jobs immediately, including one who received 11 job offers, according to Marilyn Moran, who handles public relations for the institute. It was created by Moran Iron Works, a manufacturing company in Onaway, Mich. that makes

Feds study bat protection but loggers disagree

Capital News Service A fight over logging restric-

tions is delaying federal protection of the northern longeared bat, a Great Lakes species already decimated in the American Northeast.

A decision on whether to list the bat as endangered or threatened has been pushed back to April.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, which has federal jurisdiction over protected species, is using the extra time to respond to the unexpected controversy, said Mollie Matteson, a senior scientist and a bat disease specialist at the Center for Biological Diversity.

Endangered means a species is at high risk of extinction in the wild, according to the International Union for the Conservation of Nature. Under federal law, a threatened species "is likely to become an endangered species within the foreseeable future throughout all or a significant portion of its range.'

Forest industry officials worry a federal listing will hinder logging. They propose state-enforced operational guidelines as an alternative.

The dispute lies between timber industry advocates and bat conservationists, but political leaders and state delegations also have a stake in the issue, Matteson said.

The Center for Biological Diversity, a Tucson, Ariz., nonprofit organization dedicated to the long-term protection of species, petitioned the Fish & Wildlife Service to classify the long-eared bat as threatened or endangered in 2010. And a Defenders of Wildlife petition for its endangered listing is closing in on its 50,000-signature goal.

Fish and Wildlife Service officials recommended the listing, later distributing guidelines on how best to log forests without harming the

large modular steel products, including wind turbine components and barges.

An endangered listing is a decision

backed by science, not by economics or politics, he said.

Some factions of industry are pushing for a "threatened" listing, which allows special rules to be written that would exempt certain activities such as logging in the bats' native

Timber management programs in Wisconsin and Michigan have begun to address habitat features that support long-eared roosting," said Henry Schienebeck, executive director of the Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association.

StarWatch By Gary Becker - Dobsonians: Biggest Bang for the Buck In 1967 a Vedantan (Hindu) monk by the name of John Dobson (1915-2014), intrigued by astronomy and telescope making, left the order and co-founded

(1968) the San Francisco Sidewalk Astronomers. Dobson had been building telescopes for decades and bringing astronomy to the public near his monastery, but as a Sidewalk Astronomer, Dobson and his telescopes became a national sensation among amateurs. The telescope, a simple reflector, was nothing new. The design had been conceived and first built by Isaac Newton in 1668/9. It consisted of a parabolic mirror at the bottom of a tube which sent its converging light beam back up the tube to a piece of aluminized glass. The flat secondary reflected the light cone through a hole in the upper portion of the tube where a focuser, which held an eyepiece, was located. What made Dobson's telescopes so special was the simplicity of its mount, a box-like structure which rotated and allowed the telescope to pivot up and down at its balance point. It was so simple and easy to make that Dobson often built one of his scopes in just a day's time. Dobson never patented his invention, and as a result, its design was free to be modified and enhanced by amateurs and commercial entrepreneurs alike. Before Dobson, a portable telescope's size was limited by the bulky, heavy mounting system which supported the instrument. After Dobson and the technology which kept thin mirrors from flexing, the size of the light-gathering primary mirror was essentially limited by the dimensions of the van or SUV that was used in its transportation. I've looked through 17-, 20-, 25-, 30-, and even 36-inch Dobsonian telescopes that had been easily transported to the remote site where they were being used. Start off with an eight or 10-inch model and several eyepieces; and you'll have a splendid Christmas gift that will not only be cost-effective, but will provide a lifetime of observing pleasure. www.astronomy.org

Answering machines at homeless hotline

Too many homeless veterans aren't getting the services they need when they call the hotline. The VHA National Call Center for Homeless Veterans is supposed to provide 24/7 access to support services, programs and trained counselors, coordinate with the Department of Veterans Affairs for services and monitor the referrals, connect veterans to VA and community resources, and much more.

The VA Office of the Inspector General found a lot of holes in the system during a general audit of the call center. Of the approximate 79,000 homeless veterans who called the center:

- 27,000 could only leave a message because counselors weren't available.
- 13,000 could not be referred for service because the message they left was inau-
- 3,300 weren't referred to VA medical facilities even after giving all their informa-
- 51,000 referrals were made, but the center gave no feedback on the quality of assistance given by the VA, as is required by policy.
- 24,200 referrals were closed with no follow-up, even though the VA medical facilities didn't provide any services.
- There were 40,500 instances where veterans weren't referred to services, or the referral was closed without making sure the veteran received any services.

As always, the devil is in the details. The report documents cases of unaccounted counselor time when they were logged off the system. homeless counselors being used instead for Crisis Line help (and being paid by the call-center budget), calls regularly being forwarded to an answering machine, and staff who weren't monitoring the counselors' time or calls. Here's the big number: Coun-


selors spent 61 percent of their time NOT talking to homeless veterans.

Long-eared bats, more than any other species of bat in America, are associated with old-growth forests, Matteson said. These old growth forests provide many of the habitat features – including snags and hollows – that long-eared bats prefer. And industry officials say these trees, often containing dead or dying sections, are the kind that logging operations tend to avoid.

But bats are opportunistic and generally look for any type of tree meeting their reproductive and resting needs, Matteson said.

The primary threat to the bat is white-nose syndrome, a fungal disease that takes the bats' fat reserves, killing them during hibernation. Its presence in the Great Lakes region was confirmed two years ago and in Michigan in April.

Stopping the disease has been nearly impossible, and white-nose syndrome is still without a cure. But bat advocates say other threats can be minimized to improve the fate of the mammal.

"The argument that the focus on protection of the bats should be reserved for the syndrome does not take into account factors having an influence on the species' survival," Matteson said.

Other threats – habitat loss, hibernation disturbance and environmental toxins – play a role in the near-decimation of the species in the Northeast. Matteson explained those threats are factors federal and state governments can control.

Mies, who is also the coordinator for the North American Bat Conservation Alliance, said, "Many are led to believe this species is endangered, and we should protect it for intrinsic reasons.

"But if these bats are to disappear, people will begin to see a loss of food production and an increased need for forest management," he said.

That's because bats eat lots of the same moths and beetles that destroy crops and forests. "States generally have no issue with the need for long-eared bat listing – it's an issue of details," Mies said.

As conservation advocates push for a listing that protects both the species and its surrounding habitat, some industry officials question the role of habitat in protecting bats. Schienebeck said, "The timber industry has already initiated habitat rehabilitation and doesn't see species limited by this habitat."

Despite concerns about their long-term survival, Great Lakes bats aren't dying yet. Experts say the pattern for the fungal disease takes three years to reach peak intensity. This is the third winter the disease has been in the Great Lakes, so the bats' future is at stake, they say.


The final listing determination by the Fish & Wildlife Service was originally scheduled for October 2 but has been delayed until April 2.
